



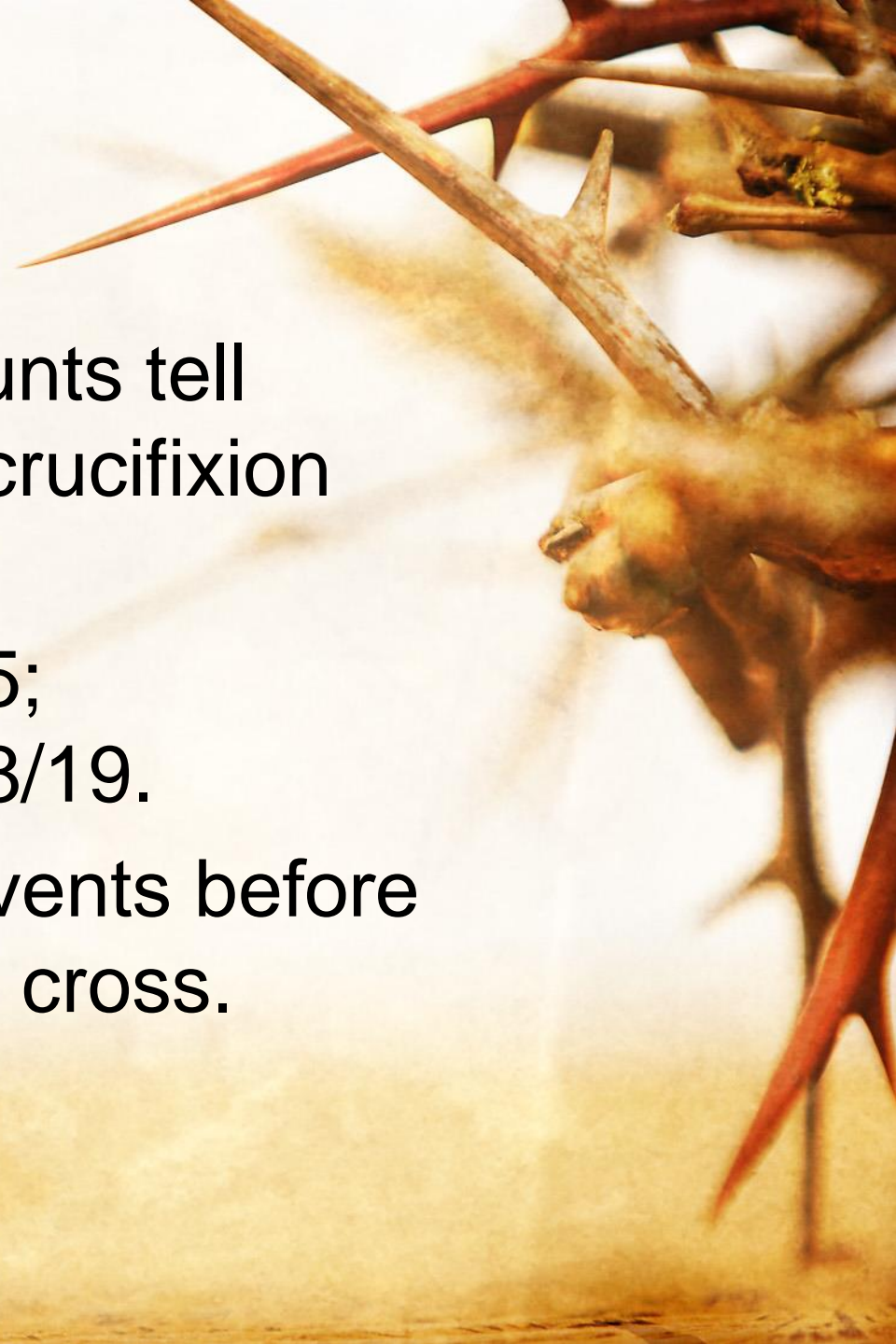
Crucified

Purpose: To recall the events of the death of Jesus.

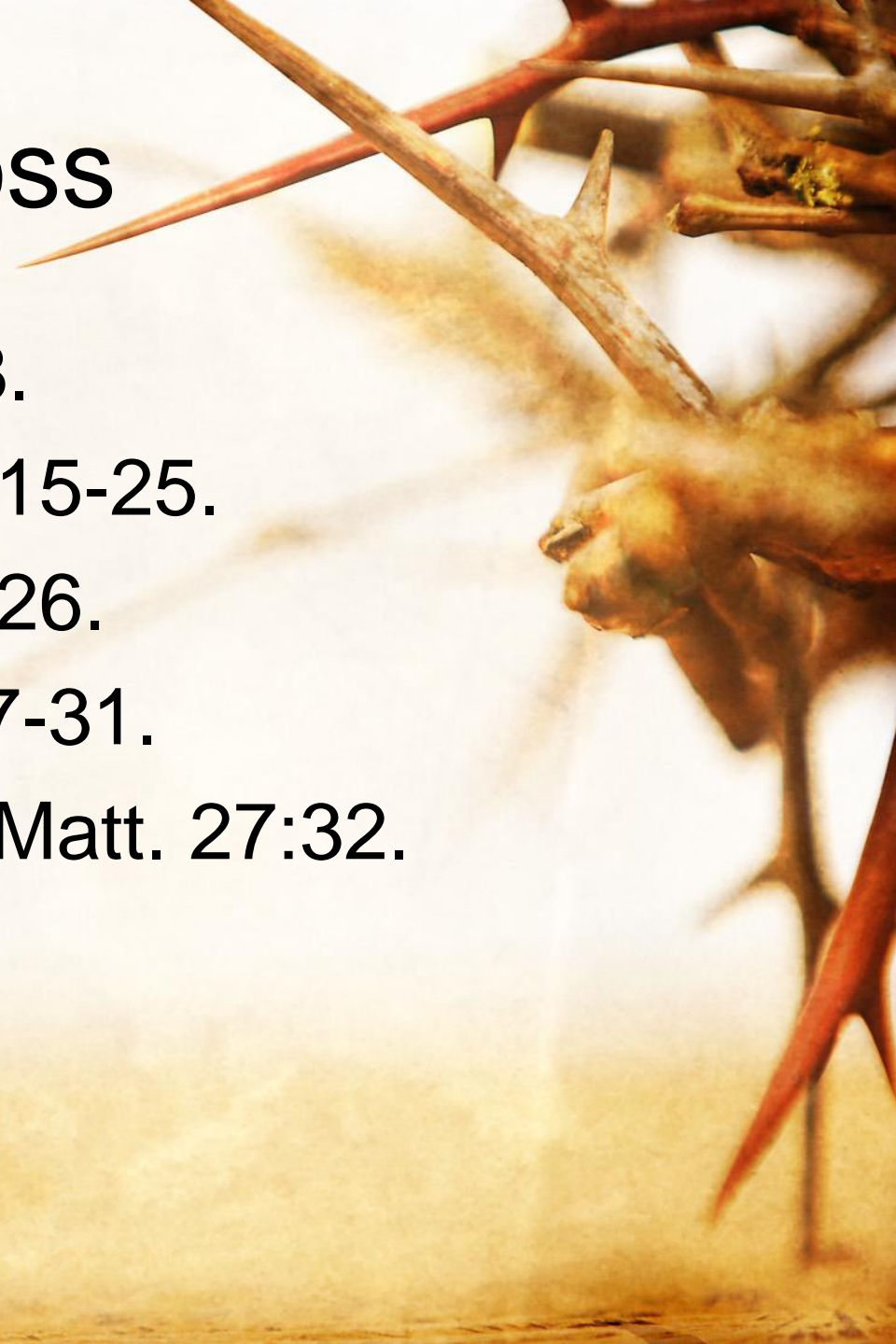
Introduction

- All four gospel accounts tell of the events of the crucifixion of Jesus.
- Matthew 27; Mark 15; Luke 23 and John 18/19.
- Let's review these events before the cross and on the cross.



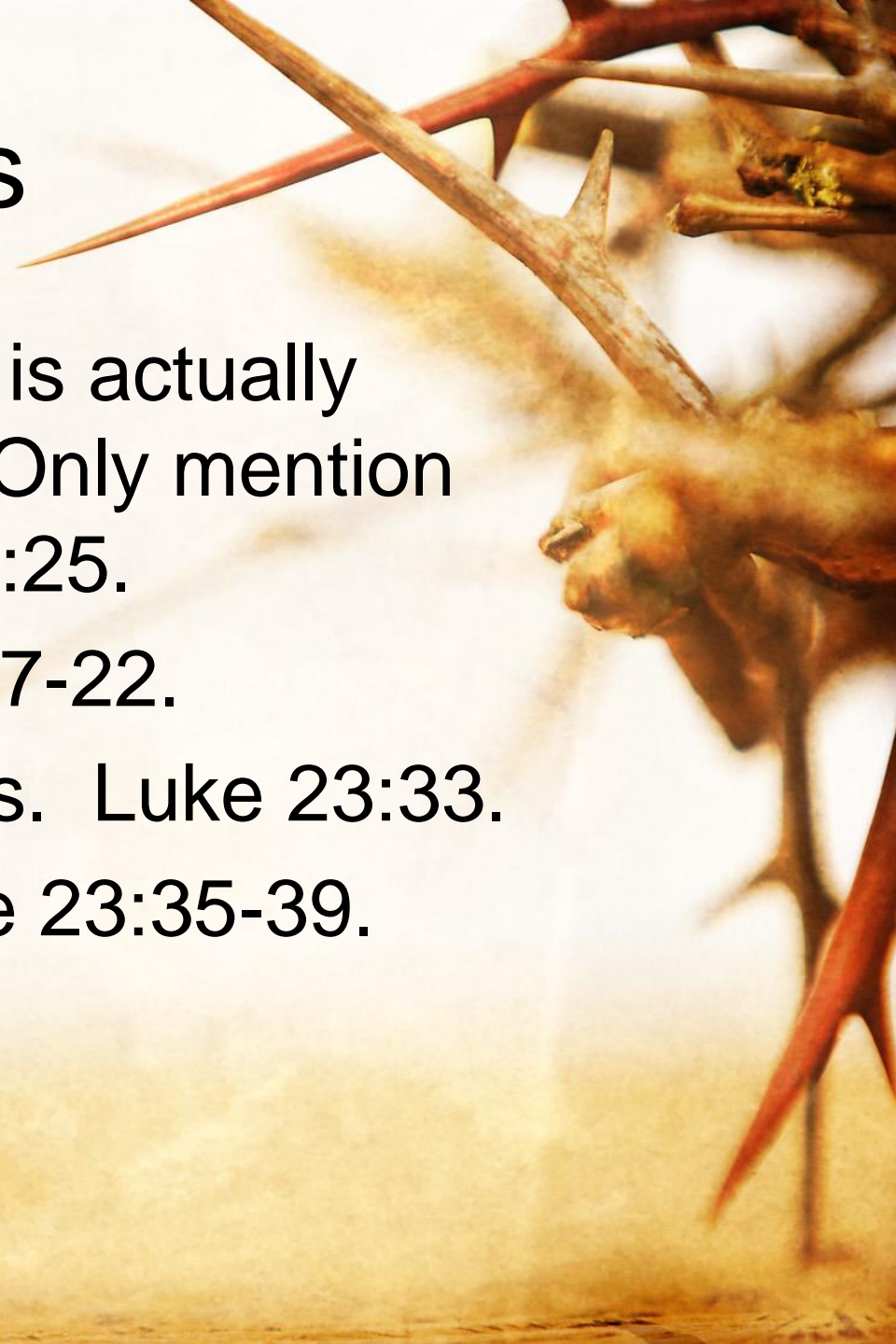
Before the cross

- Trial. John 18:28-38.
- Barabbas. Matt. 27:15-25.
- Scourged. Matt. 27:26.
- Mocked. Matt. 27:27-31.
- Carrying the cross. Matt. 27:32.



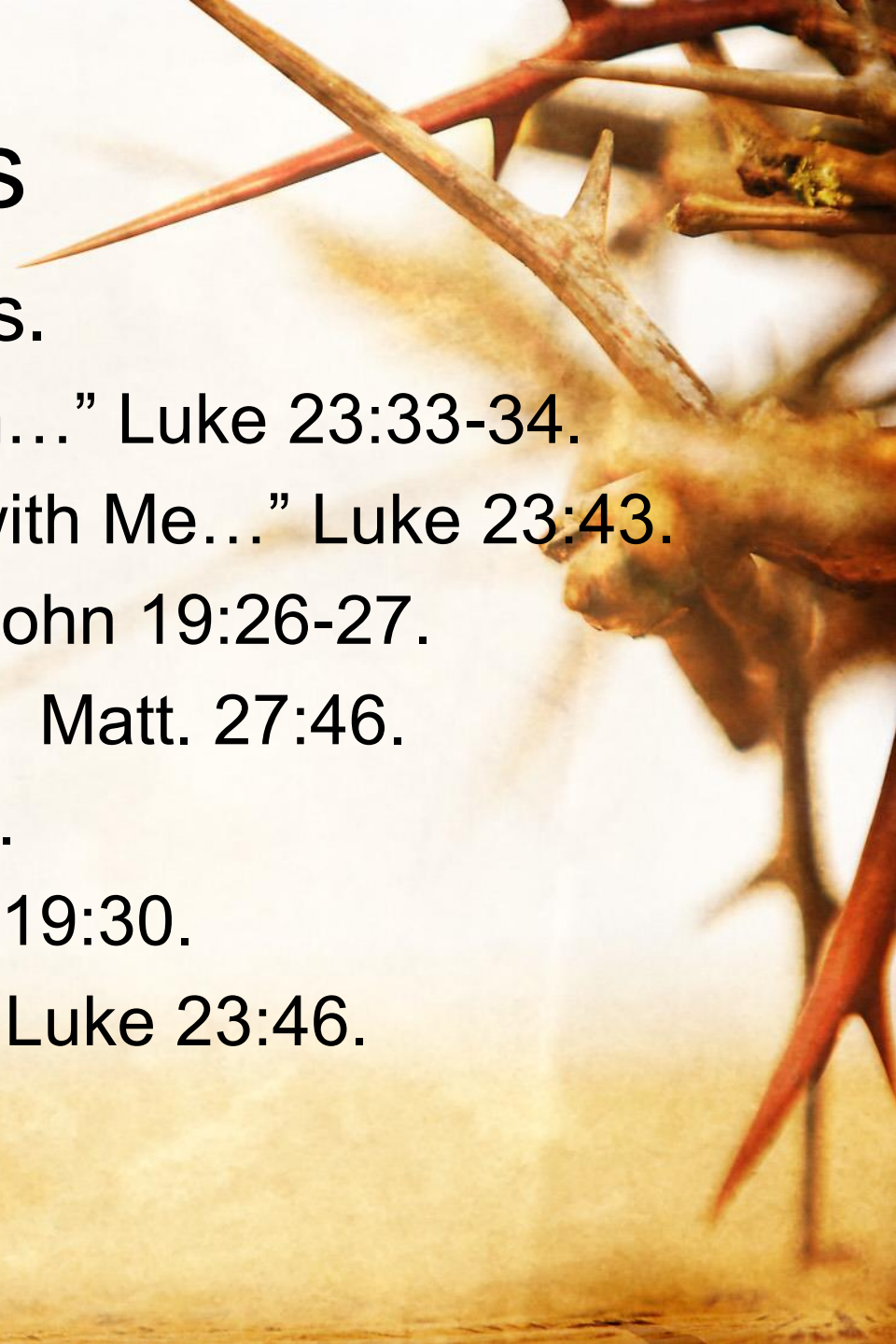
On the cross

- Crucified. Very little is actually said about this act. Only mention of nails is in John 20:25.
- The sign. John 19:17-22.
- Between two robbers. Luke 23:33.
- More mocking. Luke 23:35-39.



On the cross

- The sayings of Jesus.
 - “Father, forgive them...” Luke 23:33-34.
 - “Today, you will be with Me...” Luke 23:43.
 - “Behold, your son.” John 19:26-27.
 - “My God, My God...” Matt. 27:46.
 - “I thirst.” John 19:28.
 - “It is finished.” John 19:30.
 - “Into Your hands...” Luke 23:46.
- Death.
