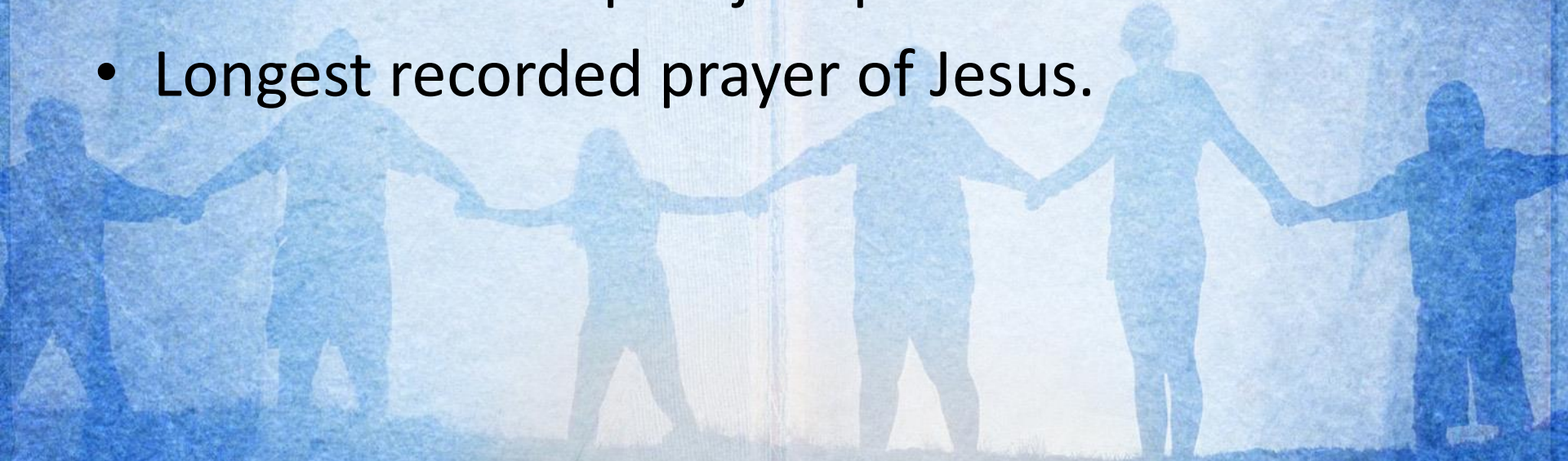


Lord's Prayer

- Last portion of the private ministry of Jesus.
- Comfort to disciples just prior to the cross.
- Longest recorded prayer of Jesus.




Prayer for Himself vs. 1-5

That They All May
Be One

- Right He possesses, 17:2. Authority.
- Relationship He offers, 17:3. With God through Jesus.
- Requirement He meets, 17:4. Accomplished, finished the work.
- Reverence He deserves, 17:5. Glorification.

Prayer for disciples vs. 6-19

That They All May
Be One

- Disciples believed on Jesus, 17:7-8.
 - Given to Jesus from Father, 17:9-10.
 - Requested spiritual protection, 17:11-16.
 - Requested sanctifying purity, 17:17-19.

Prayer for future vs. 20-26

That They All May
Be One

- Root & request of true unity, 17:20-21. Belief in Jesus, that they all may be one.
- Representation & result of true unity, 17:21-23. Unity, motive, mission, truth, holiness, love, that the world may believe.
- Fellowship & focus of future glory, 17:24-26. With Jesus, see glory of Jesus, God's love in us.

Summary

- Preservation, vs. 11, “keep them through your name.”
- Jubilation, vs. 13, “have my joy fulfilled.”
- Liberation, vs. 15, “keep them from the evil one.”
- Sanctification, vs. 17, “Sanctify them by Your truth.”
- Unification, vs. 21, “that they all may be one.”
- Association, vs. 24, “be with me where I am.”
- Glorification, vs. 24, “that they may behold My glory.”
