The last chapter of the book of Acts has been a focus of mine this week. I don't know why I was drawn to this concluding chapter of the best record of the spread of the early church and the detailed accounts of the apostle Paul; however, in my study, the last verse of Acts chapter 28 has effectively stood out in my mind like a flag flying high on a mountain. Unashamedly detailed in this verse, we see how Paul spent his last recorded days in Romans house arrest.

"And he stayed two full years in his own rented quarters and was welcoming all who came to him, preaching the kingdom of God and teaching concerning the Lord Jesus Christ with all openness, unhindered" (vs. 30-31, NASB).

What catches my attention as I read this is the fact that even while being restrained for the "hope of Israel" (28:20), meaning the good news of the Messiah and salvation through Him, Paul does not allow his unfair and unfortunate circumstances to cause him to retreat in his mission. It's this unwavering determination and dedication that captures me, and I pray it speaks to you today as well. Far too many times, Christians become mentally trapped as we focus on the unfortunate and displeasing circumstances in life that we fail to see the potential for faithfulness and advancing the cause of Christ by simply remaining dedicated and determined to the purposes of God in all circumstances, both that are pleasing and displeasing to us.

How do we do that? What can we learn from Paul that would help us imitate his drive and focus regardless of our circumstances? I would ask you to consider the following about the apostle Paul revealed in this last chapter and allow them to both challenge and inspire you.

- 1. Paul preached the gospel whenever and wherever he had opportunity. (vv. 16,20,23,30)
- 2. Paul's message was clothed in humility and graciousness. (vv. 17-20)
- 3. Paul preached biblically and doctrinally. (vv. 23, 31)
- 4. Paul never wasted opportunity. (v. 17)
- 5. Paul preached tirelessly and incessantly. (vv. 23, 30-31)
- 6. Paul preached to everyone Jew and Gentile. (vv. 23-28)
- 7. Paul kept the focus on Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior. (v. 23)¹

For every Christian, the single most significant portion of our story is of our redemption through the blood of Jesus Christ. No matter what may come our way, both good and bad, circumstances of life can't out-shine nor blot-out this glorious testimony. The circumstances merely serve as vehicles and avenues for us to tell others of Jesus Christ. As we think about the coming New Year, may we all rededicate ourselves to this mindset and cause.
