Taking it for Granted

We flip a light switch and the lights are supposed to come on. We get into our car, and we expect that when we turn the key it will crank right up. When we're hungry, we open the refrigerator or the pantry and just know food will be there. We turn the facet on and expect clean water to flow into our cup.

What do all of these have in common?...They are all simple actions or pleasures of life that we continually take for granted. They've become so much a part of our lives that we don't think much about them – much less give thanks for them. However, if there's ever a problem with one of them, we notice it immediately.

In Luke 17: 11-19, we learn of a situation that Jesus encountered after having done a wonderful miracle for some men who were sick with leprosy. Because of their sickness, they were not allowed to be with their families, the people of the city, or participate in any of the normal activities they once enjoyed. Upon seeing Jesus approach, they cried out to Him for help, "Jesus, Master, have mercy on us!" (v. 13) Being compassionate and loving, Jesus healed them as they went to show the priests their new condition.

We can imagine their newfound excitement as they are reunited with friends and family members; however, as we read verses 15-17, we are confronted by the selfishness that even we at times fall victim.

"Now one of them, when he saw that he had been healed, turned back, glorifying God with a loud voice, and he fell on his face at His feet, giving thanks to Him. And he was a Samaritan. Then Jesus answered and said, 'Were there not ten cleansed? But the nine – where are they?"

It's important that each of us recognize that Jesus noticed the nine didn't come back to give thanks for getting their lives back. We can't imagine how anyone, after being given a second chance like these, would not want to fall to their knees and express their sincere thankfulness to God Almighty. However, when things are going well – it's easy to forget the One who makes it all go.

May we always be thankful for the simple pleasures, and never be so wrapped up in ourselves that we forget to thank God for giving us life through His Son, Jesus.
