Choosing God Over the World

Each time I meet a new person, I tell myself not to get too close to them. There's always a constant nagging in the back of my mind, telling me they're going to dislike me or, even if they do enjoy spending time with me, they're going to leave eventually. So, I distance myself and hope that they don't try to get closer.

I guess my relationship with God used to be the same. I didn't want to wholly depend on Him because I was almost certain that if He ever would leave anyone's side, it would be mine. I focused on myself because I believed that was all I had. I became selfish and really angry inside. This led to the worst period of my life. And who was there through it all? Supporting me even though I didn't want to realize it? God.

When I reflect on all He has pulled me out of, I realize just how broken and weak I truly was. For the entirety of my adolescence and a chunk of my young adulthood, I was pushing away the only constant I truly had to depend on. Because of His love, even though I was denying Him, He was steadfastly holding my hand through everything (Isaiah 41:10).

That's what God does. He wants to be with us forever, and we have to choose Him just as He chose us. Deciding to set your heart and soul on God through baptism *literally* gives you a new life and delivers you from the pain and heartache you face day-to-day (Romans 6:4, II Corinthians 5:17 & Psalm 34:17). Why would you want to keep looking back when you can look forward toward the kingdom of God? Stop being caught up in where you've been, and appreciate where you're going!

Focusing on the past and letting it dictate your current state of mind instead of living in the here and now is detrimental to your mental and spiritual health (sometimes physical, too)! Depression, anxiety, and sin can eat away at your heart, mind, and soul. The pain seems insurmountable, and the weight you feel on your shoulders is incredibly hard to relieve. It's actually *impossible* for us to relieve. We have to turn to Jesus, the only *real* form of relief we have.

God rejoices in the decision we make to turn to Him. Whether we woke up this morning replaying yesterday's mistakes or assuming the worst in the day's potential, God can and will forget your negativity and bring you out of the slump you're in. He will erase all your cares and lift you up to a place of exaltation (I Peter 5:7).
