An Unexpected Prayer

Can you imagine the pain of trying to become pregnant month after month yet failing to do so? Some of you can. What if the month after month turns into year after year? Some of you can understand. The pain. The hurt. The exhaustion. The internal demons and doubts that begin to creep into one's mind, and worse, heart. The strain this must put on a marriage relationship and the overall shadow it must cast upon one's world view. To make matters exponentially worse, your next-door neighbor continues to birth child after child and go so far as to make fun of you for being dried up and unable. Pure misery.

In a nutshell, this was Hannah. Year after year going to the Shiloh, the city of the priest where yearly sacrifices are made, and year after year praying for a child with no results. Emotionally drained and potentially filled with negative self-speech, is our Hannah in 1 Samuel 1. But then the unthinkable happens! Through fervent prayer, an undying faith, and the grace of God, she becomes pregnant. Her promise to God was, if a child came to her, she would lend this child to God. This meant giving up the child she desired for years and years. Giving up the child that had filled her once aching heart. None of the above. Go to 1 Samuel 2:1–10 and read a focused prayer of praise and adoration. Listen to a heart that clearly understood, no matter the circumstances I will praise God almighty! For the sake of space and time, allow me to share with you one phrase that ought to be a regular phrase used in our daily prayers, "My heart glories in the Lord; my strength is exalted in the Lord... There is none holy like the Lord; there is none besides you; there is no rock like our God." (1 Samuel 2:1, 2)
